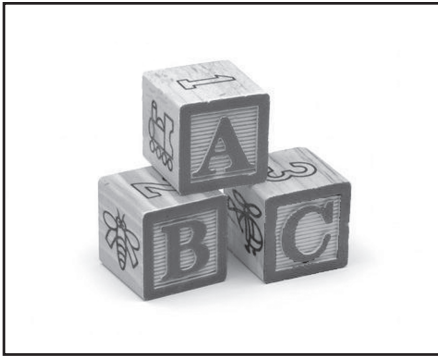

Helping Relatives Raise Children



BACKGROUND

The Georgia Legal Services Program (GLSP) Kinship Care Project provides civil legal services to low-income families in forty-two (42) counties. The GLSP Kinship Care Project focuses on stabilizing the legal relationships between the relative and the dependent child and fostering the economic stability for this newly formed family. GLSP utilizes a holistic approach to address the legal and the economic needs of relative caregivers.

Legal representation assists relatives thrust into the position of being caregivers to their relative's children because of the parent's: death, HIV/AIDS or other illness, drug or alcohol abuse, domestic violence, military deployment, and economic problems.

The GLSP Kinship Care Project covers three regional office areas: Augusta, Piedmont and Savannah. Please contact your area's office for further information.

SERVICES PROVIDED

Legal Representation

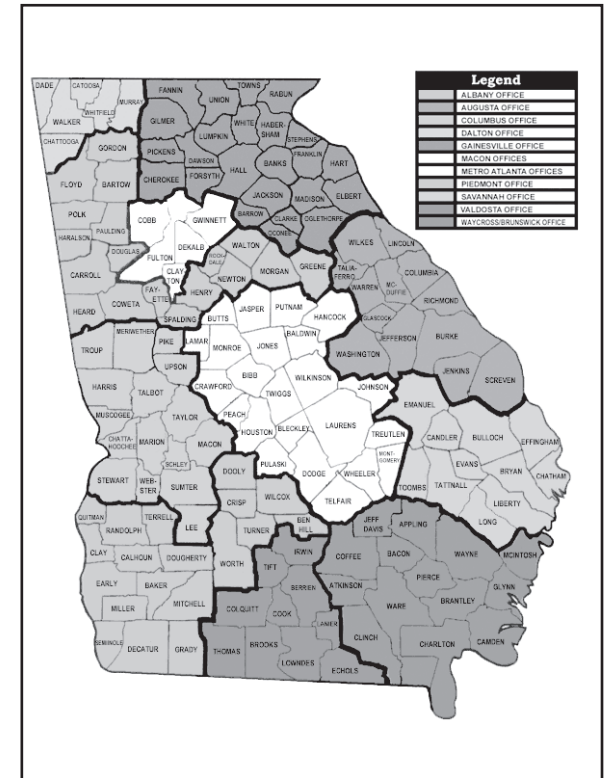
GLSP's Kinship Care Project provides legal assistance to kinship care families to stabilize legal relationships and to secure their economic stability. Through its legal services, GLSP assists families in the rural and the urban areas of Georgia. GLSP attorneys represent families in custody disputes, guardianships, adoptions, public benefits, educational matters, and consumer problems. GLSP directs litigants who are representing themselves in their attempts to stabilize their relationships with their minor children through guardianship.

By providing access to the courts through legal representation, the GLSP Kinship Care Project supports its goals to protect families during crisis and to lift families out of poverty.

Outreach

GLSP also conducts workshops and distributes written materials to inform relatives of the legal services and the financial assistance available to them. GLSP attorneys traveled to senior citizen centers, grandparent support groups,

tenant's associations, and health and nutrition fairs to conduct workshops and to disseminate information to relative caregivers.



THE FUTURE

By providing legal representation at a time of crisis and helping to financially secure families, GLSP has met and exceeded its project goals. GLSP looks forward to continuing and expanding the Kinship Care Project throughout Georgia.

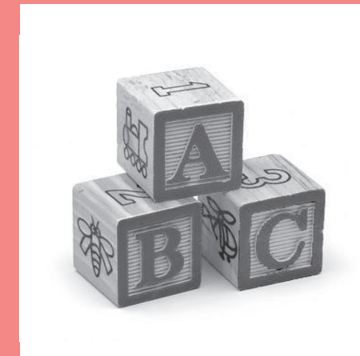
